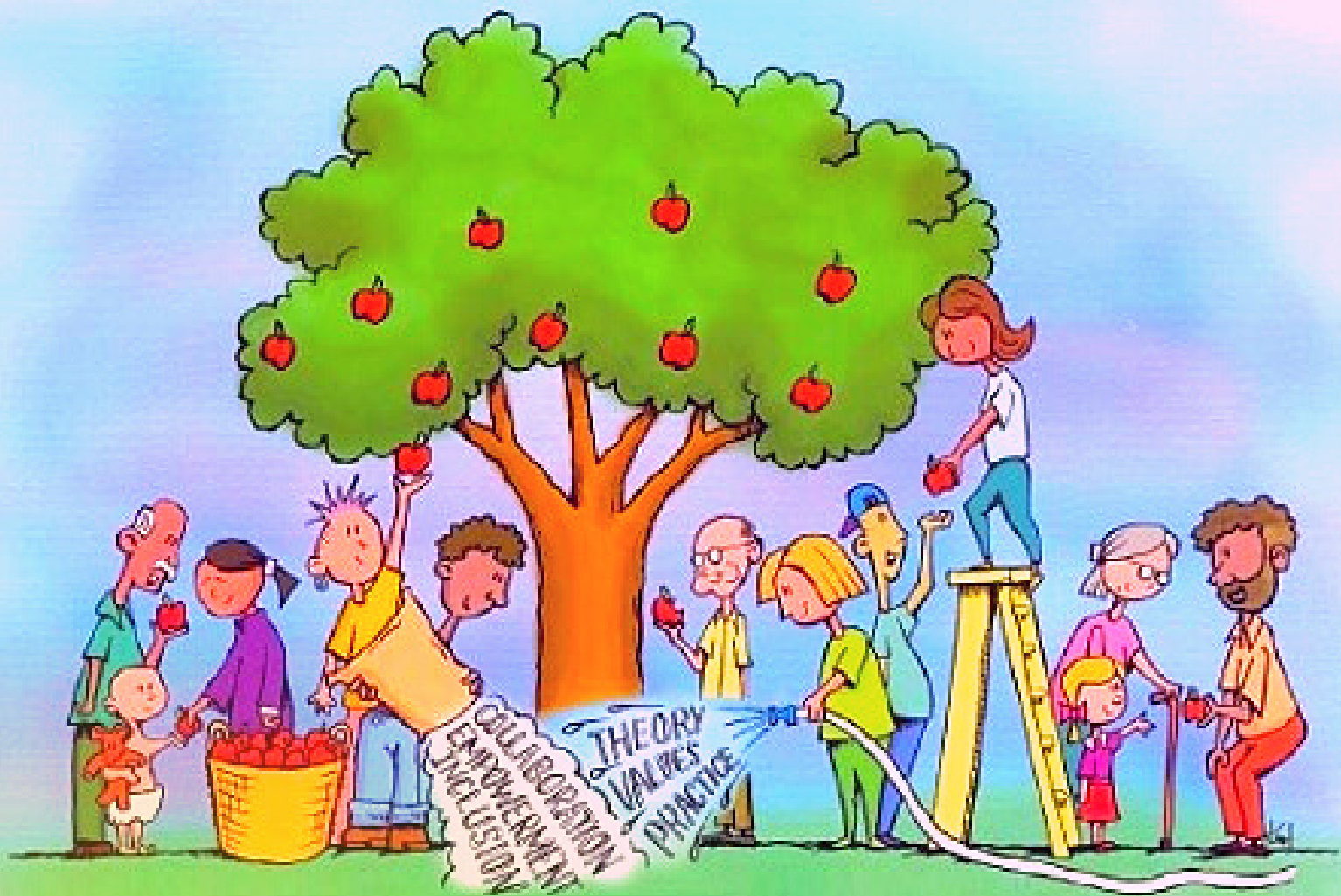

Since the years of its existence ABSK has been providing social and humanitarian services to the poor and marginalized sections of the society in collaboration with National and International organizations, through various projects; related to Agriculture, Promotion of Child rights and ensuring child protection, Women empowerment, Education, Livelihood, Community health, HIV/AIDS, Strengthening of CBOs, Natural resource management, Promoting renewable energy options and Capacity building.

# SPECIALIZED ADOPTION AGENCY (SAA)

Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra as a Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA) has been facilitating the placement of orphan, abandoned and surrendered children in adoption since 3rd February 2014 under the department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare Government of West Bengal. It is Registered under u/s 34(3) of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000 read with Sec. 71 of West Bengal Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Rules, 2009 JJ Act. The home is situated at ROSHNI, Vill- Ekpere, Ausgram I, Purba Bardhaman.

# CHETANA COMMUNITY CARE CENTRE

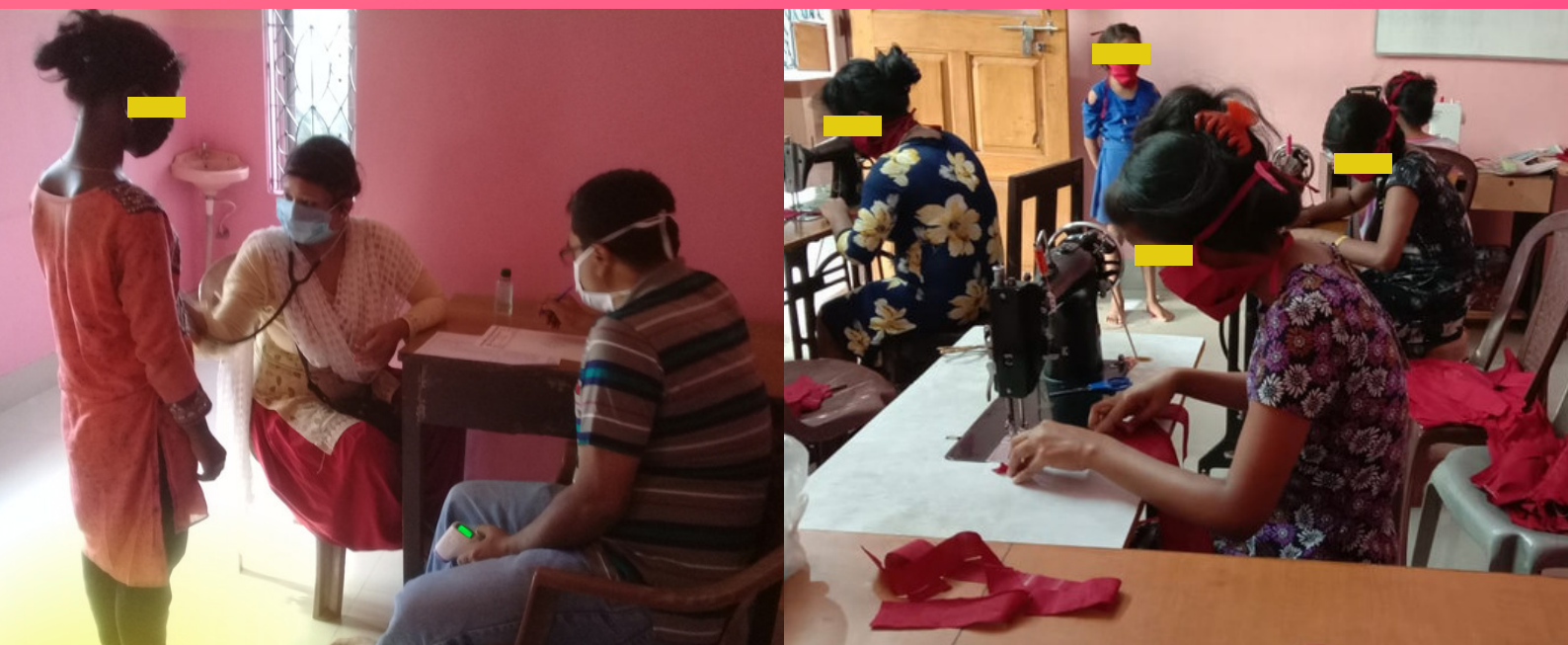


Chetana Community Care Center is one of the different projects run by Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra at Jhinguti, Bardhaman. This Project Started in March 2011 to deal with the people suffering from HIV/AIDS. The Chetana Community Care Center at Bardhaman promotes access to care & treatment to the girl children living with HIV/AIDS & providing them lodging, fooding, treatment and admission to different schools for educational purpose within the district and surroundings. Now Chetana CCC home is the second home in West Bengal for the safety and rehabilitation of the HIV affected & infected children(girls).In the year 2017 it is approved by the government of West Bengal, under the department of women & child development and social welfare as a Home for the Children with Special Need for HIV/AIDS affected & infected children.

- Currently 26 children are living in Chetana home
- 26 children are receiving formal education

## Our services are

- Providing proper treatment
- Providing all types of nutrition food support
- Providing secured shelter
- Providing education facilities
- Providing positive counseling
- Providing various training (like stitching, beautician, computer, dancing, etc)
- Involving in various sports & competitions

# UTTORON - II

This project intends to ensure the community and their efforts to provide adequate nutritious food and accessing their rights and entitlement and livelihood options through on-farm and off-farm by strengthening community-based mechanisms. This project also ensures and empowers food and livelihood security through= foster climate-resilient & climate adaptive agriculture and livelihood. It also helps the poor and marginalized people to nourish themselves even in the time of crisis of food. Currently, we are working in 15 villages of Purba Bardhaman District (Bhatar Block).

# SOLAR ENERGY PROMOTION

ABSK is concerned about environmental safety and thus promoting solar power in the rural areas, through which we are connecting houses from darkness to light. From the point of view of capacity building, It is a great opportunity for unemployed youth to develop solar light, as a source of income generation. ABSK working on the project of solar energy promotion in collaboration with the Association of Bengal Collaborators for Development and MISERIOR.

## Prospect Of Solar Energy Promotion

- The poor marginalized are enabling to access solar energy to uproot the darkness from their lives.
- The youth are motivated to take initiative for their development and capacity building by providing training on producing solar lamps.
- The solar energy promotion spread out the source of natural light
- Installation of solar panels improves education, health, agriculture by powering water wells and pumps for clean drinking water and year-round crop irrigation.
- Solar energy powers the environment and life on the planet, so there is no energy source more earth friendly.
- It is protecting our earth from green emission and global warming

# WADI

WADI project is a NABARD funded Tribal Development Programme(TDP) which aims at promoting sustainable livelihoods for tribal communities and enhancing their income security. "Wadi" means a "small orchard" covering one or two acres. This project intends to promote orchard development among the tribal communities. It is envisaged as family-centric agriculture where the emphasis is on small landholdings (1-2 acres), agrobiodiversity and greater participation of women and family farming.

ABSK is implementing this project in two places of West Bengal i.e Rajnagar of Birbhum District and Saltora of Bankura District. This initiative refers to eliminate the livelihood problems of the tribal families. The targeted families are empowering themselves towards better livelihood through small orchard formation by nurturing cashew, jack fruit, and mango plants in an organic way. It provides beneficiaries the basic information and advantages of orchard farming, organic farming, as well as microfinance for the marketing of the products.

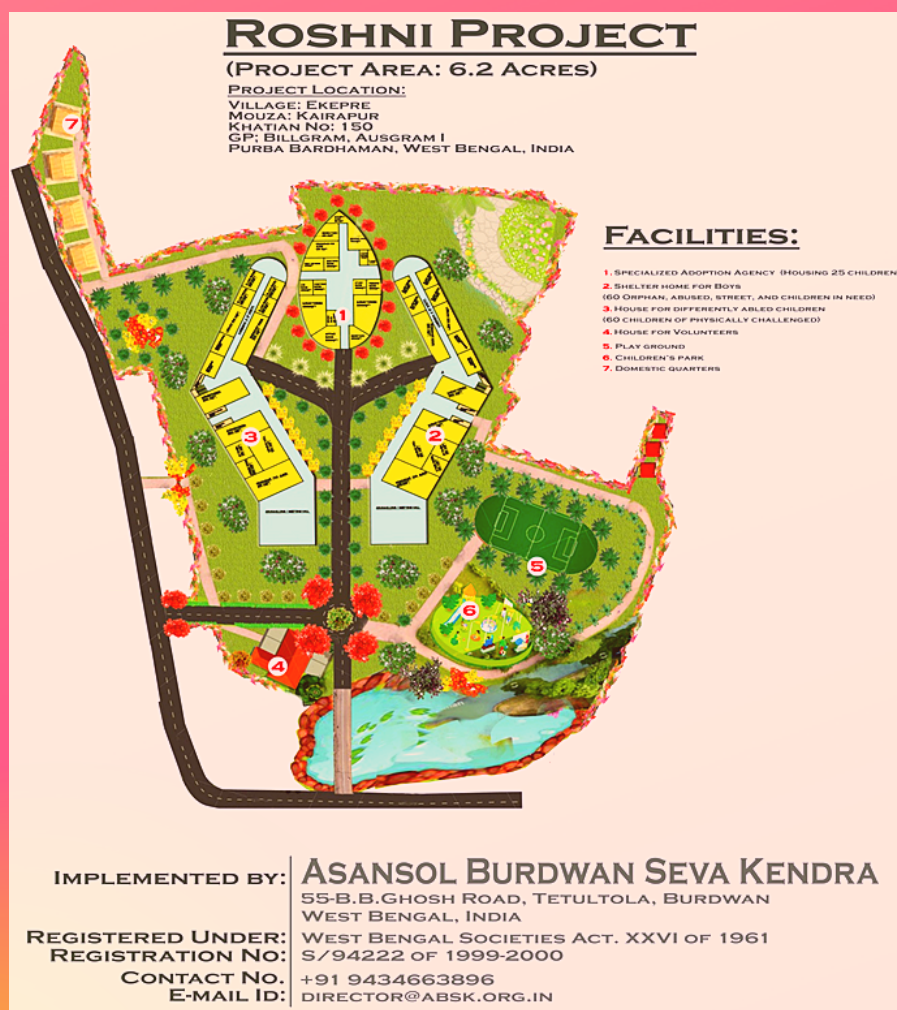


# ROSHNI

Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra has started a new project called "ROSHNI" having the concept of "Children in GOD's Hand", in 6.2 acres of land at village Ekepere, Kairapur, Purba Bardhaman.

It consists of-

- Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA)
- House for differently-abled children
- Shelter home for boys (orphan, abused, street and children in need)
- House for Volunteers
- Domestic Quarters
- Children's Park
- Play Ground



## Mission of ROSHNI

To provide a sensitive and caring environment for children in difficult circumstances endowing accommodation, Physical and Psychological care, education with legal protection and rehabilitation by removing the barriers that rob children of the opportunity to realize their rights.

Other residential buildings' constructional work and the developmental works for ROSHNI project at the ROSHNI site are in process and ongoing.





# COVID -19 RELIEF PROGRAMME



On 11th of March 2020, World Health Organization had declared COVID-19 as a Pandemic disease. This declaration proves it a fatal health emergency for the entire world. Since the commencement of total lock-down started on 23rd march 2020, by Central as well as state government, Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra Burdwan had been involved themselves in the relief distribution, awareness-building activities, sanitizing community and many more humanitarian works. We, as a Social Service Society, feel delighted and happy to be a part of the Humanitarian Drive. We have covered Birbhum, Bankura, Purba, and Paschim Bardhaman districts, reaching out to a total of 23,630 worst affected families.

We also have distributed packages of dry ration kit consisting of 5 kgs of Rice, 2 Kgs of Masur Dal, 500 Gms Mustard Oil, 50 Gms of Chili Powder, 100 Gms of Soybeans, 500 gms Salt, 1 Kg of Onion/ 2 Kgs of Atta, 1 bathing soap and 1 piece of Detergent soap. These packets of Dry Ration and essentials kit had been distributed amongst **18,280 people**; each of these packets can sustain a 4 member family. We organized a community kitchen for **150 poor people**. We also have supported **4000 families** with Masks and Sanitizers. People were relieved and delighted to get little support from us. We tried to reach out to the most downtrodden ones. This measure was taken to support poor communities to fight with corona outbreak.

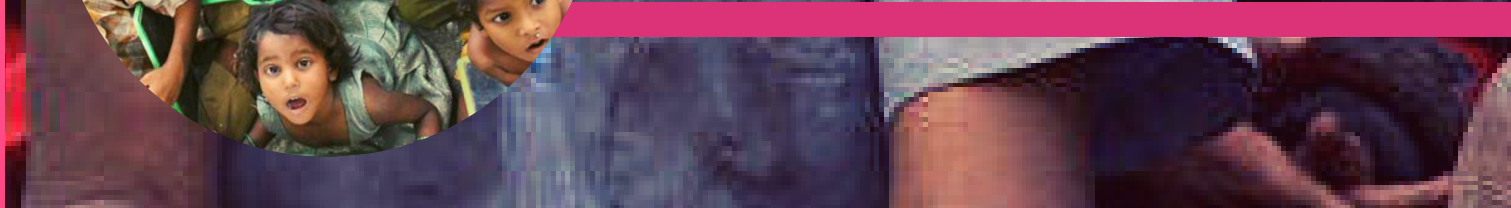
