To provide a better future CHILDLINE 1098 is working for them 24 hours a day, 365 days a year since 22nd February 2011 for children between 0 to 18 years of age who are in need of Care and Protection. ABSK-CHILDLINE is a collaborative organization that takes care of children in distress in 3 Municipality and 14 Blocks of Purba Bardhaman District in West Bengal.

CHILDLINE 1098 is India's first toll-free helpline number for children in distress that spells hope for millions of children.

CHILDLINE not only respond to the emergency needs of children in distress and provide them with long-term care and support by linking them with different services but also protect children and adults from social evils by making them aware through awareness programmes.

Case Study

“Awareness– the first step”

On one peaceful evening, CHILDLINE received information about an abandoned 2 years old child by one of the allied sources.

The child was brutally tortured by neighbor with whom he was left. CHILDLINE immediately took in-charge of the child and provided him with medical treatments in government hospital, but the child's condition was very critical.

With dedication and care of the CHILDLINE staff towards the child, he won the battle of life; and after his recovery he was handed to his father.

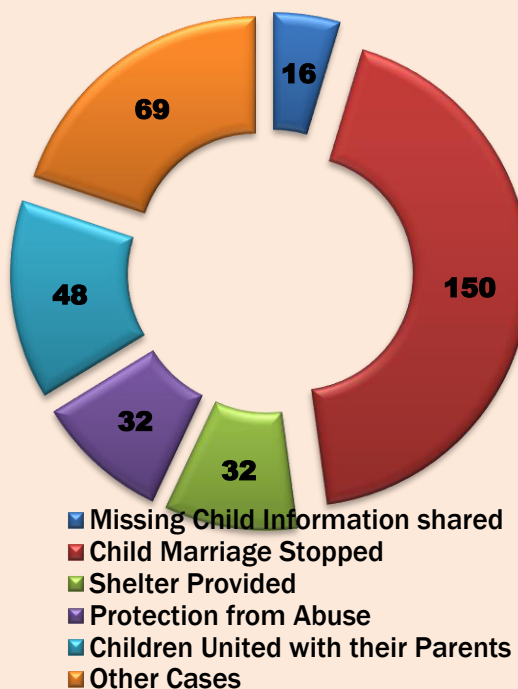
Impact of the Project

347 Cases were intervened.

Case Study

“Giving new life”

A 2 days old infant was found in Saktigarh railway station by RPF. After getting this information the CHILDLINE team quickly responded and went to Saktigarh station. The CHILDLINE team took in charge of the abandoned infant and went to nearby medical centre for checkup.

In between, the team informed about the case to DCPU (District Child Protection Unit), DSWO (District Social Welfare Officer), CWC (Child Welfare Committee).

After all the examinations the infant was found to be mal-nourished, weighed 1900 grams. The doctor who examined her advised that with proper medicines she will become healthy.

After receiving order from CWC, CHILDLINE, Burdwan handed over the infant to ABSK-SAA (Specialized Adoption Agency) for proper care and protection.

Specialized Adoption Agency

The Specialized Adoption Agency of Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra is a Child Care Institution as well as adoption centre for children between the ages of 0-6 years. It has been facilitating the placement of orphan, abandoned and surrendered children since 3rd February 2014. The ABSK-SAA is registered under 41 of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015.

Our SAA got sanctioned to keep 10 children. It is located at ROSHNI, Vill- Ekpere, Ausgram, Purba Bardhaman.

Chetana Community Care Centre

Chetana Community Care Centre is a Children's Home for HIV+ girl children between 0-18 years of age. The Project is located at Jhinguti, Burdwan. It started serving the HIV+ children since March 2011 and is registered under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act.

Chetana Community Care Centre is dedicated to the holistic development of the children. It provides shelter, strict nutritious diet, regular checkups and treatment, education vocational training and many more. The hard work and dedication of ABSK was recognized by the Government of West Bengal and in the year 2017 under the Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare as a Home for the Children with Special Need due to HIV infection.

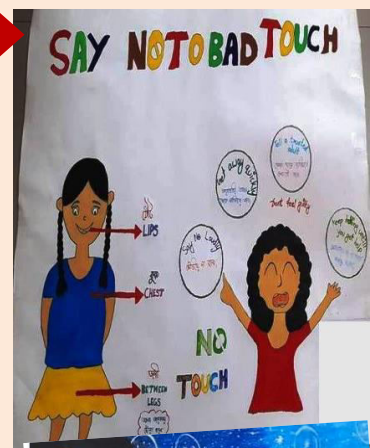

Solar Energy Promotion

Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra (ABSK) is concerned about environment and sustainability and thus promoting solar energy in the rural areas of Burdwan with the Motto “From Darkness to Light”. The Solar Energy Promotion is working under 6 districts of West Bengal in collaboration with Association of Bengal Collaboration for Development and MISEREOR.

ABSK is implementing the project in 1 Block- Bhatar of Purba Bardhaman District.

Solar Energy Promotion not only aims in providing sustainable environment but also generates livelihood through trainings of making solar lamps. The Solar Energy Promotion team generates awareness through Community Based Organization meeting, Village Solar Committee meeting about environment sustainability and promotes using renewable energy for better future.

Impact of the Project

- 06 Gram Panchayat covered which includes 19 villages.
- 253 Households started using Solar Products.
- 94 Saplings were distributed with the message of Environment Sustainability.
- 1610 people got aware about Sustainable Energy

“Making our Future Generation Aware”

A school awareness programme on solar energy was arranged by the Solar Energy Promotion team in KPP High School, Gramdihi in which 159 students participated.

The awareness programme was carried on by a quiz competition. The students as well as the teachers actively participated and got aware.

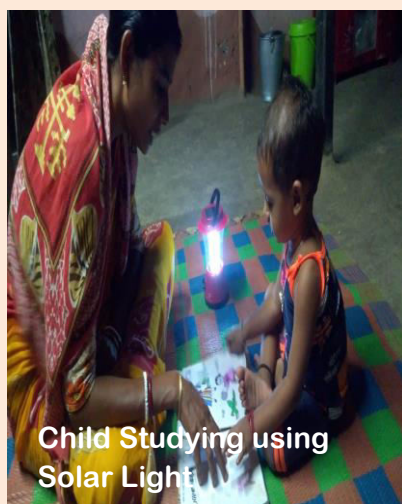

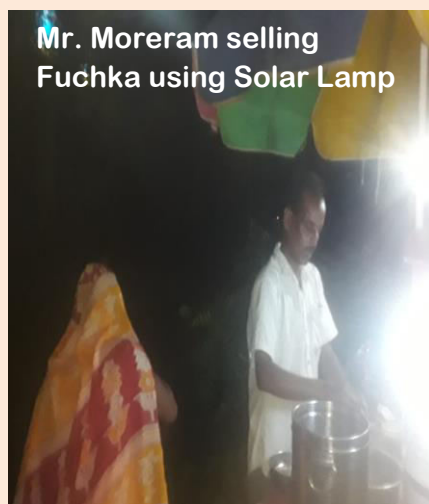

Case Study

“Solar Lamp is helping Fuchka seller to grow his business”

Mr. Moreram Das, a 52 years old Fuchka seller used to sell his fuchkas using candle light in the evening for light. Because of using the candle light he could not able to work efficiently.

One day while our Solar Energy Promotion team was conducting a Community Based Organization meeting; he also attended and took keen interest in solar energy. In the meeting he got all the information about solar energy and solar lamp and decided to buy one.

Now, he is using the solar lamp for selling fuchka and also at home. Using solar lamp helped him to give more time in work and also his family too uses it when there is Power Cut.

UTTORAN

Uttoran strengthens the community by ensuring adequate and nutritious food. Efforts are made for accessing their rights, entitlement and livelihood options- on farm and off farm through strengthening community based mechanism. Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra is the implementing the programme for 600 households in 15 villages under 2 Gram Panchayat- Bonpass and Sahebgunj 2. The project area is located in Bhatar block in Purba Burdwan district.

The majority of the household belongs to scheduled tribe and has less agricultural cultivable land, so their main livelihood depends on share-cropping and daily wage earners.

Impact of the Project

522 households were given awareness on livelihood options.

139 successful received Government benefits.

191 people were trained on model kitchen garden, Root Zone Fartigation model (RZF), Pollution Free Poultry Farm (PFPF), Duckery, manure & organic pesticide making & aware & guide beneficiaries on new & running Govt. Schemes.

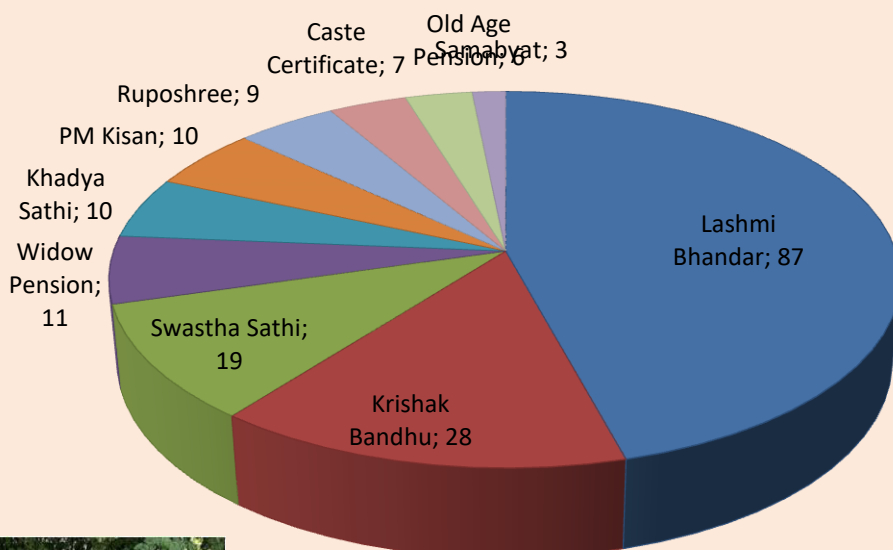

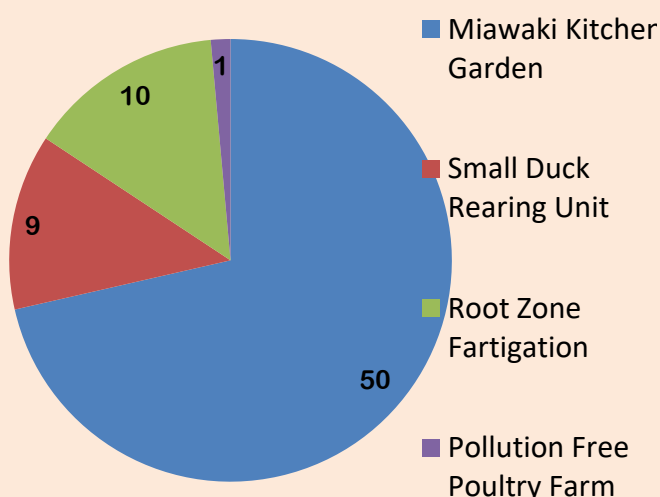

Case Study

“Supporting farmers by making them aware of new techniques”

Subrata Chowdhury is an owner of 1 bigha land; he came across Uttoran with Climate Adaptive Agriculture Practices meeting. With the support of Uttoran he started organic farming with few vegetables and got positive result.

Previously, he had to go to the market to sell his vegetables and was not profitable due to high transportation cost but now he has started to sell his organic vegetables at his own farm at reasonable price. Due to high in demand of organic vegetables in his area he has employed labors to help him.

He has also started off farm with duck farming. With the support of Uttoran he is earning well and expanding his business.

WADI

WADI is a NABARD funded Tribal Development Programme aims in promoting sustainable livelihood for tribal communities and enhancing their income security.

Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra implemented WADI programme at Rajnagar Block, Birbhum to develop the livelihood of Tribal community through plantation and allied activities. The beneficiaries have formed Rajnagar Farmer Producer Company Limited with the support of the project.

“Roshni” which means a ray of light, is the name of three children projects at Ekpere village, Purba Bardhaman. Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra has inventiveness for the most vulnerable section of the society, i.e. children. We have taken a step ahead for achieve our vision of enabling and empowering the marginalized section.

Our one of the three gems, SAA has already started functioning in the year 2020. The other two projects are- a Shelter Home for Boys and a Shelter Home for differently abled children.

Roshni is not just a name but truly ‘a ray of hope’ for those children who do not have a place to call it home.

The project ROSHNI consists of:

- Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA)
- Shelter Home for Boys (who are in need of care and protection)
- Shelter Home for Differently- Abled Children
- Volunteers House
- Domestic Quarters
- Children’s Park

Safe Home- COVID Relief Activity

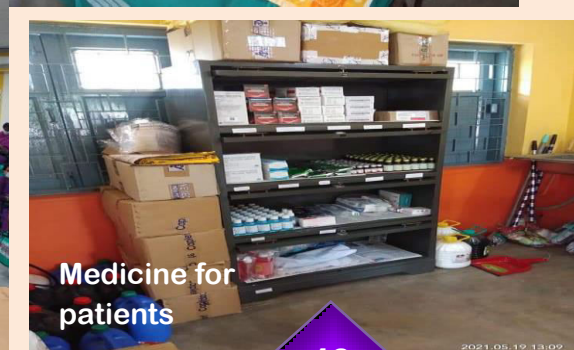
In the Second Wave of COVID 19 Pandemic which started from March 2021 till June 2021, India witnessed tremendous havoc in four months.

During this uncontrolled situation many individuals, volunteer organizations, NGOs, CBOs came forward to save lives. Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra also started a Safe Home in Human Resource Development Centre at Chetana which is a part of the Asansol Diocese. It was administered by Asansol Burdwan Seva Kendra in collaboration with the Government of West Bengal. The services we provided in First-line treatment centre were:

1. Ambulance Services 24*7
2. 30 Beds
3. Free medical facilities
4. 24 hours Nurse were present
5. Two doctors regularly came for checkups
6. Oxygen were kept for emergency services.
7. Nutritious food was provided to the patients.

During this time of fear, some people came forward to support our work as volunteers. We had Sr. Taramai and Sr. Coresipsa as Nurse and Sk. Abdul and Rayman as drivers for Ambulance. Other miscellaneous activities were done by Sr. Binu, Avinash, Kalpana, Louis, Sanatlal, Munshi Md, Varanika, and Meri.

We also distributed 80 medical kits among Asha Workers for COVID 19 Response in Burdwan I Block. The kit consisted of Steam Inhaler, Oximeter, N95 Mask, Sanitizer, Hand wash Liquid and Thermometer.





Shining Eyes India

Shining Eyes India was established in February 2013 to improve the health of tribal children by providing them with Medical Support. We are presently working in 12 villages at Bolpur, Birbhum District of West Bengal.

The children hospital offers preventive checkups for newborns and pregnant women, supplementary food for malnourished children, as well as diagnostic and treatment for anemic, infectious, neurological, or TB suspected individuals. Patients in severe condition are referred to specialized health facilities but in accompaniment and continuous monitoring by staff members.

Through the preventive medical work in the tribal villages the trust tries to eliminate the causes of severe infections and to reduce child and mother mortality.

We also work for Family work for Family Planning, Dental hygiene and kitchen gardening.

Impact of the Programme

- 116 Children received NutriMix, a healthy food for malnourished children
- 255 families are growing their own food.
- 2642 Children and 1057 adults came for treatment in Health care Centre.
- 241 Children and 22 Adults were admitted in the centre.
- 1536 Tests were performed that includes X-rays, EEG, ECHO, ECG, Gynecological screening and TB.
- 42 Ligation was performed in women who have three children

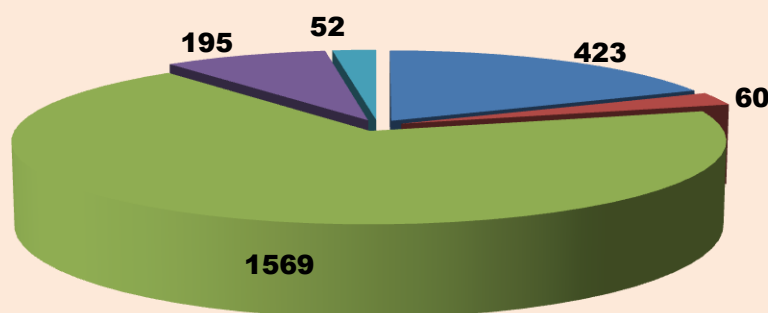
